Bicycling advocates: Use of trail through Maryland growing

Bicycling advocates in Maryland say use of the Great Allegheny Passage through Western Maryland is growing.

Adventure cycling guide Larry Brock said more than 60,000 people have been counted along the 20.5-mile Maryland section through September of this year.

That's up at least 20 percent from 2008.

The Great Allegheny Passage runs from near Pittsburgh to downtown Cumberland. From there, travelers can continue on the Chesapeake & Ohio National Historical Park to a path along the Potomac River into Washington.
